... There used to be a hotel on Ch. Paiement, across from #3902. It was called the Forest Hills Hotel and this editor has family members (McHenry's) who worked there in the 1950's, as dishwashers and luggage boys.

....Sainte-Agathe-des-Monts used to celebrate winter with its' own winter festival, named "Snow Fiesta". It included parades, dog sled and sulky races, an ice castle, and downhill ski races. - Huge fire destroyed 84 buildings in town on May 26, 1923
- There used to be a zoo north of town, which accommodated over 1,000 animals.

NEW WAY TO SURF!


Like probably many of you, I had the opportunity to see this surfer last summer. Wow! What a beautiful invention this electric surfboard is!


