Our cohabitation with nature often provides a dilemma: do I give priority to my pleasure of being able to see more of the lake or do I let nature take its' course? I try to find a balance. Perhaps I could plant lower-growing shrubs or hardwoods that, even in summer, do not hide the view.

In the past, we didn't know much about the repercussions of planting and cutting. However, we now know that we must protect these sensitive ecosystems that are the lakes.

... that Princess Elizabeth visited Sainte Agathe des Monts before she became Queen?

On November 4, 1951, Princess Elizabeth, Duchess of Edinburgh (the future Queen Elizabeth II of Canada) and Philip, The Duke of Edinburgh, attended the service with the rest of the local congregants at the Holy Trinity Anglican Church in Sainte Agathe. A small Legion guard of honour was standing outside the church and two college groups were in place to play "God Save the King", all in front of a crowd of about 2,000 people. Elizabeth & Philip returned to the private property where they enjoyed a horse-drawn sleigh ride and stayed until boarding the royal train in the evening for a 5am departure for the Maritimes.
